Watching the precision and teamwork displayed in the sky has motivated countless individuals to explore careers in the Armed Forces, aviation, engineering, and related fields. In a time when recruitment and retention are ongoing challenges, removing such a visible and inspiring symbol would be counterproductive.

The Snowbirds also serve as ambassadors of Canadian excellence, both at home and internationally. They reinforce national pride and unity, appearing at events across the country and reminding Canadians of the capability and professionalism of our armed forces."

"Disbanding the Snowbirds would not simply be an administrative decision—it would be a cultural loss. It would be akin to seeing the beaver disappear as a national symbol, or reducing poutine to nothing more than "potatoes and cheese." In both cases, something uniquely Canadian is diminished into something unrecognizable. The Snowbirds are part of that same national fabric."

"I urge you to consider the broader implications of this decision, particularly its impact on recruitment, public engagement, and national identity. Preserving the Snowbirds is an investment in both the future of the Canadian Armed Forces and the spirit of Canada itself.
